



Neurological rehabilitation

The neurological rehabilitation at the Clinique Valmont is directed by Julien Bogousslavsky, MD, a worldwide renowned specialist.

Dr. Bogousslavsky's main interests include clinical neurology, localization within the brain, eye movement disorders, and above all cerebrovascular disease and stroke, including clinical trials. His contributions in behavioral neurology include the extended-syndrome, hyperacute aphasia syndromes, and fatigue from focal brain lesion. In stroke, his studies have covered virtually all fields, including epidemiology, heart disease, lacunar stroke, acute emotional disorders, post-stroke depression, neuroimaging, Doppler ultrasound with transcranial signal analysis, borderzone ischemia, and clinical-topographic subtypes correlation.

Dr Bogousslavsky graduated from the University of Geneva in 1978. After a clinical fellowship with Henry Barnett in Canada, he founded the Lausanne Stroke Registry, which has now included over 5000 patients with first-ever stroke. Dr Bogousslavsky was appointed consultant neurologist in 1984 at the University Hospital, Lausanne, Switzerland.

Dr Bogousslavsky was the founder of the European Stroke Conference and elected chairman of the European Stroke Council (term 1998-2000). He is president-elect of the International Stroke Society for 2002-2004. He was a member of the executive committee of the European Neurological Society between 1997 and 2001, and of numerous societies, including the American Neurological Association. He acts as a permanent representative of the World Federation of Neurology to the World Health Organization and as an expert for organizations, including the Food and Drug Administration, the European Community, the British Medical Research Council, and other national research councils.

Former head of university service and a regular professor of neurology, 2007 Visiting Professor for the Master of Neurosciences at the University of FrancheComté. He is an FMH specialist in neurology, coordinates as a Neurocentre GSMN (Center for Brain and Nervous System Diseases), and heads neuro-rehabilitation at the Clinique Valmont, a private rehabilitation clinic.

He speculated Europe and America in the management of brain attacks, sclerosis Parkinson's disease, migraine, cognitive memory, and affections of the nerves, muscle, and spinal cord.

Dr Bogousslavsky is author or co-author of over 500 articles published in peer-reviewed journals and author and editor of 25 books. He has given over 120 guest and named lectures in all continents. He is currently editor-in-chief of European Neurology and of Cerebrovascular Diseases, as well as a board member and reviewer for 20 journals.
